Community Partner Spotlight

SafePlace Update

Thanks to a generous grant from Impact Austin, SafePlace has been piloting phone counseling as an innovative approach for reaching adult domestic and sexual violence survivors. In its first year of operation, the program has served over 100 people who were not able to participate in more traditional services, due to issues with transportation, childcare, and physical or emotional limitations.

One of those survivors, Lucia, was shot by her partner after an evening celebration with family and friends. She was shot in the abdomen in front of her 3 year old son and was left bleeding in the street. She was rushed to the hospital where she had emergency surgery. Four vital organs had been damaged and her prognosis was poor.

When Lucia began phone counseling, she was barely out of the hospital and Child Protective Services had custody of her son. Phone counseling allowed Lucia to receive support related to her abusive relationship and the trauma of almost being killed while homebound recovering from the surgery. In time, her nightmares lessened and she realized that a life of abuse was not acceptable. With the help of her phone counselor, Lucia grew to acknowledge her strengths. She gained confidence toward accomplishing her goals of learning English and furthering her education. She is now working, lives in her own apartment, and has regained custody of her son. Both are doing well.

At the time I joined Impact Austin, my husband and I had suffered through several heartbreaking years of infertility and miscarriages. During my first year as a member, I was on the Family focus area committee, and my grant review team was focused on the Adoption Coalition of Texas. That was the first time my husband and I ever seriously talked about adoption. I would come home from meetings, and we would look at the beautiful children the Adoption Coalition featured in its Heart Gallery.

Within months, we had contacted an adoption agency, and in October 2008, we brought home our beautiful little boy!

I am grateful to Impact Austin for opening our eyes to adoption, and I am proud to be a member each year!"
